3. Trophy Research Update

Helen J. welcomed Joan to the meeting. Firstly, Joan requested that the matter of insurance be added to the trophy sub-committee's recommendations. She also recommended that a sub-committee be formed to organise the information in a digital format e.g. Richard Evans, Mike Burns and David Gibb. Missing information has been a significant problem and Joan recommended that the Club should keep more accurate records that are updated on a regular basis. The Club has 43 trophies in total and the last time a proper count took place was 2000.

Joan congratulated the Club on winning RYA Scotland Club of the Year.

Joan would like the trophy she donated to be awarded to Niall Ferguson in recognition of his sailing success at other clubs. Joan also asked the Committee to reconsider the use of the trophy she donated.

Joan was thanked for her report and recommendations which the committee will give due consideration.

Youth Regatta

7. Finance Report

George presented the latest finance report. Around 50 members have not renewed their membership and have not informed the Membership Secretary that they wish to leave the Club.

Insurance is due for renewal in August. We may get a significant reduction by switching to the Highland Council rate.

8. Clubhouse Works (changing room)

John Morrison and Duncan MacLellan have reported back on the amount of work that needs to be carried out on the gent's changing room. The walls and tiles must be stripped off and ventilation must be improved.

During the building work the toilets will need to be closed but the showers can be used when work is taking place.

Richard felt it would be prudent to get a plumber in as soon as possible.

1 WC and hand basin may be enough in the future (for the men's). This will improve the area and save some money (£2- 3K approx). James will be John Morrison's contact and the works report will be circulated. Once everyone is happy with the price and work to be done then John will be given the go ahead. (13/3/12) AP3

Helen J. suggested that 11 years worth of cruiser winners should be recorded on the cup.

The cup will be awarded annually at the CSC regatta to the winner of the slow handicap cruiser class. In the event of amalgamation of slow and fast classes to be awarded to the highest placed slow handicap cruiser in the fleet.

The Committee agreed that we would spend £66 to get previous winners engraved on the cup.

The Committee approved the trophy guidelines that Helen produced based on Joan's recommendations. This could be reviewed/updated at the AGM. It will be posted on the website for the membership to look over and comment on.

The Committee discussed the possibility of forming a working group that would be responsible for presenting the trophy history in a report. This group would then liaise with Richard Evans who could put the report on the member's area of the Club website.
