GUEST MEMBERS – the purpose of this category of membership is solely to create a category of people who wish to assist in the running of Club activities (for instance as Assistance Safety Officers) while not benefitting from any of the membership benefits listed above. These members will not be required to pay subscriptions.

Terms and Conditions

Item	Entitlement and Conditions
1.General conditions	Entitlements only apply provided membership subscriptions are kept up to date. All members are to maintain insurance for any boat or other vessel they own, or part own, that is kept or used at the Club or on the moorings including third party and public liability indemnity for at least £2,000,000.
2.Senior subscription rates	Senior subscription rates apply when a member is of State Pension age on 1 January of the membership year. For couples the rate applies when the younger of the couple is of State Pension age.
3. Junior subscription rates	Junior subscription rates apply to members who are under 18 years of age on 1 January of the membership year.
4. Student subscription rates	Student subscription rates apply to members in full-time education.
5. Visitor subscription rates	Visitor rates apply for membership of up to 2 consecutive weeks.
6. Member of Moorings Association	Entitled members may become a member of the Moorings Association on payment of the relevant fee and on signing the appropriate lease. Details via the Harbour Master.
7.Exclusive use of clubroom	Members may book the clubroom for private functions with the Social Convenor. Bookings will only be accepted when there are no Club activities scheduled and on the condition that the Member takes responsibility to leave the room as found. The Member booking will also be responsible for securing the clubhouse on completion. Information on charges is available from the Social Convenor at social@chanonry.org.uk
8. Access to clubhouse	Members who already have a key to the Clubhouse may continue to use this. Otherwise, members, other than juniors, will be given the access code to the key safe at the front door. Members using the clubhouse are responsible for securing the building at the end of their activity. Juniors should only access the clubhouse when an adult member is present.
9. Use of dinghy park	Members may use the dinghy park as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Members may store one dinghy, tender or other small vessel in the dinghy park on payment of the storage charge payable at the time.• Space permitting members may store extra dinghies on payment of the storage charge applicable at the time.• The storage fee for small vessels (eg kayaks) is for the space occupied by the boat's footprint. If you can stack one on top of the other tidily and securely then that would just require one storage fee.• All boats need to be tied down securely to avoid damage to themselves and to other boats.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Launch trolleys and vessels with no trolley must be labelled with owner name and phone number. • Running rigging must be tied back to prevent noise disturbance to our neighbours. • In the period following New Year and shortly before the first club sailing event of the new season, members who do not intend to sail during this period should remove their boats from the dinghy park. Where they are unable to do this, masts ought to be un-stepped.
10. Cruiser berthing in the harbour	<p>Members may keep a boat in the Harbour by agreement with the Harbour Master and on payment of the agreed berthing charge.</p> <p>Members are not to moor in such a way that renders the harbour steps unusable by other boats.</p> <p>Members are to take direction from the Harbour Master where given.</p>
11. Use Club dinghies	<p>Members may use the club dinghies when they are not required for training purposes, provided a safety boat is on the water and the helm is qualified to RYA Level 2 or RYA Stage 2 or has been assessed as competent by the RTC Principal at training@chanonry.org.uk.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Breakages are to be reported to the RTC Principal.
12. Use Club St Ayles Skiffs	<p>Members may use the St Ayles Skiffs as long as sufficient crew are available and the cox is assessed competent by the Rowing Secretary.</p>
13. Use of slipways	<p>Trailers & trolleys must not block the slipway except when in actual use.</p>
14. Use of hard standing for cruiser storage	<p>Members of the Moorings Association may store their boats ashore between crane-out and crane-in provided space is available and on payment of the storage charge payable at the time.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Boats must be stored in cradles or purpose-built trailers and masts are to be un-stepped. • Cradles and trailers must be removed from the Club premises following crane-in.
15. Occasional use of harbour	<p>Entitled members may use the harbour to undertake maintenance of their boats for loading and unloading.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stays expected to last longer than 24 hours should be booked in advance with the Harbour Master. • Members are not to moor in such a way that renders the harbour steps unusable by other boats. • Members are to take direction from the Harbour Master where given.
16. Attend training	<p>Training is open to all members and can be booked via the RTC Principal at training@chanonry.org.uk.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fees may apply depending upon the nature of the training. • Shore-based training may also be opened-up to non-Club members by agreement.
17. Take part in Club open events	<p>All members can take part in Club open events on payment of any event fee.</p>
18. Purchase Club merchandise	<p>A range of merchandise carrying the Club logo can be purchased, see the club website.</p>
19. Purchase discounted RYA Pubs	<p>The Club can obtain discounts of between 20 & 30% on RYA Publications including DVDs. The Club marks-up publications to the nearest whole pound to cover P & P but most of the saving is passed on to the member. Orders or more information via the Training Principal. Cash on delivery.</p>
